

PARISH TRUSTEE NOMINATION

Every parish in the State of Wisconsin, besides being a faith Community, is also a legal corporation of Wisconsin. As such, it is subject to state corporation law, which means (among other things) it must have five trustees. The archbishop and the vicar general of the archdiocese are ex-officio trustees in every parish of the archdiocese. The pastor/parish director of the parish is the third ex-officio trustee. The parish also has a trustee-treasurer and a trustee-secretary.

The term of our Trustee-Treasurer, Rebecca Porter, expires on June 30, 2024. Rebecca is willing to serve another term.

The pastor/parish director may nominate one candidate for the position. Accordingly, Deb has nominated Rebecca Porter for the position of trustee-treasurer. Should anyone else desire nomination for this role, state law dictates that we follow this process: such a person must be an actual member of the parish, at least 25 years of age, and must receive the written support of at least 10 other adult parishioners. Nominations should be submitted to the parish office with the accompanying names and signatures of supporters no later than May 29, 2024. Please contact the Parish Office if you have any questions about this process.

According to state law, this notice will be published here for four weeks. Should there be other nominee(s), biographical information will be available the weekend of June 1-2 with an election held the weekend of June 8-9.

Your warm smiles and friendly hellos make all the difference, so mark your calendars and get ready to make memories! See you there! "Everyone who hates his brother is a murderer." (1 Jn 3:15).

"Racism shares in the same evil that moved Cain to kill his brother. Every racist act—every such comment, every joke, every disparaging look as a reaction to the color of skin, ethnicity, or place of origin—is a failure to acknowledge another person as a brother or sister, created in the image of God. In these and in many other such acts, the sin of racism persists in our lives, in our country, our world." – A Pastoral Letter: USCCB

We don't like to acknowledge it; in some states it is illegal to write or speak about it, but systemic racism persists in nearly every aspect of American life: banks, schools, companies, government, law enforcement, employment, education, home ownership, healthcare, and incarceration.

A Harvard University study found that when Blacks "whitened" their resumes by using white sounding names, their callback rate rose from 10 to 25%. Since many jobs are obtained through social networks, the survey found that 75% of white employees do not have any non-White friends.

In 2021, overall income for Black Americans was 49% lower than for White Americans. The poverty rate for Black families was twice that of White families.

There are more statistics that illustrate the persistent effect of racism; we can easily discover them. Let us acknowledge the evil of which the bishops speak, and with the courage of Jesus work for justice and follow his one command: "Love one another."

Why Are You Standing Here?

How long did the disciples stand staring into the sky after Jesus left? These disciples had been utterly dependent upon Jesus during His earthly life, yet He expected them to take the Gospel message to all the world? They were confused and concerned, finally needing angels to tell them to stop straining their necks and to remember what Jesus had promised them.

Jesus would not leave them orphaned. He would send them an Advocate, a Comforter, a Counselor who would remind them of all His teachings. One


