

# **NOTES FROM DEB**

### Some Thoughts on the Eucharist

Today is the Feast of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi to some of us), a holy day to celebrate the Eucharist we receive and the Eucharist we are. We are the Body of Christ. While we can spend hours and hours, years and years learning about the Eucharist, I feel being a people of the Eucharist isn't about understanding it or knowing everything about it. It means caring for those who are poor, who are alone, who are struggling in life. To quote St. Augustine, "we become what we receive."

### The Power of Listening

The award winning actor Alan Alda once said, "Listening is being able to be changed by the other person." Vulnerability is essential to that transformation. The listener must be open, focused, and perhaps most important, silent.

Listening is becoming a lost art. As technology advances, we are constantly bombarded with more and more messages. Sometimes I stop listening just for peace of mind. And as our world becomes increasingly divided, it is easier and more comfortable to pay attention only to those messages that match my own frame of reference for the world—a practice that begets more division.

I was blessed to participate in a recent visioning session with OLOL's Pastoral Council where we engaged in the synodal process: pray, listen, discern, react, and share. Each person in our group of four had two minutes to express his or her own thoughts on the question presented. The other three could not react or respond, but simply had to listen. After each of us had our two minutes to speak, we each had one minute to react to what we heard, while the others listened.

What emerged, within our group and between all the small groups, was far more common ground than outlier ideas. This common ground becomes a starting point from which we can grow and move forward together.

It gives one pause. Perhaps the simple act of listening holds the key to reducing the noise around us and healing divisions. Who are you listening to? Cory Anshus, Pastoral Council


