Juneteenth: Faith and Freedom Documentary June 17 | 6:15pm–8:30 pm | OLOL Hall A

Do you know why Juneteenth Day is a federal holiday? It commemorates the end of legalized slavery in Texas on June 19, 1865. Texas was the last Confederate state to do so. On June 17, 2021, President Biden signed the Juneteenth National Independence Day Act as law, making June 19 a federal holiday and giving national recognition to a day commemorating emancipation. The film Juneteenth invites viewers into the story of Juneteenth through the eyes of a Black man, Pastor Michael Waters, learning about the holiday from direct descendants of those liberated in 1865. Although the conversations are informative, Pastor Waters is troubled by the legacy of American slavery and the misuse of Christianity to justify it.
