Being a Welcoming Church

With Jesus as our example, we should never be shy about welcoming others. Whether it's welcoming friends into our home, visitors into our church, or just saying hello to a stranger on the street, as Christians we should display the welcoming attitude of God.

It is not always easy to welcome the poor, the sick or anyone we might consider "different." Our kindness and openness to all is not only a reflection on Christianity as a whole, but it reflects on how we think of Jesus.

Go and make someone feel welcome today!

Some questions for reflection from today's readings:

- Often the prophets among us, the truth-speakers, are seen as irrational, out of touch, and are shunned and marginalized. Is there someone whom you recently dismissed in such a way, and can you identify deep within their message a kernel of God's truth revealed?
- What Christian paradox do you have the most difficult time with? Death is new life? Weakness is strength? The last shall be first? Something else? What makes it difficult?
- Who in your faith community is the wisdom figure, respected because of their keen insights, experience, and age? Who is a marginalized person with a voice that needs to be heard, and why is their voice cast aside?
