

Email Scams

- Any email we send will come from an ololmke.org extension. If it is from Gmail, archmil.org, or any other address, it is not from us. The archdiocese still uses archmil.org, but parishes do not.
- We will not ask you for gift cards, donations, or a generic call for help through email or text.
- If you are unsure about an email or text you have received, call the Parish Office to confirm it is from us.

Open Our Hearts to Nonviolence

The Season for Nonviolence is the time between January 30, the anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi's assassination, and April 4, the anniversary of the assassination of Dr Martin Luther King Jr. It was established in 1998 as a tool to spread awareness. During these 64 days we are invited to work towards creating a culture of nonviolence in our lives and our communities. Nonviolence is not just the absence of violence, but it is establishing practices and actions which help all people be treated with dignity. It becomes a force to help win rights and freedoms, ensure affordable education, work towards renewable energy sources, and restore dignity to all people.

Nonviolence includes finding a place for all at the table by working towards establishing a support system for all migrants and immigrants, for the LGBTQ community, for people of color, and other oppressed peoples. It means we need to look at our own actions and beliefs and begin to make some changes in how we approach the larger community around us.

The goal of the Season for Nonviolence is to inspire individuals to make daily nonviolent choices and to take action centered around the five pillars of nonviolence: respect, understanding, acceptance, appreciation, and compassion. Mahatma Gandhi said, "Be the change that you wish to see in the World."
