NOTES FROM DEB

As you know, we replaced our south parking lot last year including having some zoning disagreements with the City of Milwaukee. It was our understanding, and the understanding of our contractor, that we did not need a building permit, nor did we need to install new landscaping. It turns out that we were incorrect on both counts. Bottom line: we need to add a significant number of trees and shrubs to be in compliance with the mandates from the city.

The landscaping plan that is acceptable to the city includes 20 trees and 138 shrubs. Planting trees and shrubs is a great thing for our property and for the care of our Earth, but this large expense is quite unexpected.

Also unexpected are the bequests we receive from parishioners who have passed away. The final numbers are in from the bequest I wrote about two weeks ago. Our general fund (pays salaries, bills, etc.), the food pantry, and the Love One Another campaign each received \$56,240. Our St. Ben's Meal program has received \$168,720 (that's a lot of chicken!), and our improvement fund has received \$224,960. We have also received another bequest that is in the \$28,000 range.

Finding ways to use these funds that honor the donor's wishes is a lovely problem to have! But it is also important that we not stop our charitable giving. Buying extra food for our pantry, supporting the parish, and bringing in bakery for St. Ben's is important to the folks we serve, but it is important to us and to our identity as disciples. I will keep you apprised at how we will use these funds, and again, thank you all for your continued stewardship of Our Lady of Lourdes.
