The Season for Nonviolence is the time from January 30, the anniversary of Mahatma Gandhi's assassination, to April 4, the anniversary of




the assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. During these 64 days we are invited to work towards creating a culture of nonviolence in our lives and our communities.
