## **CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING**

Jesus advises his followers in a way that we are unlikely to advise our loved ones. Allow someone to strike you? Allow someone to take advantage of you? This is not what we teach our children. There are cultural and historical layers to unwrap here, but let's look beyond the seeming impractical nature of what Jesus is saying. To pray for and extend kindness someone who mistreats us helps us to see their humanity. We live in a world filled with conflict. If we cannot see our enemies as human beings, we are lost. We cannot negotiate with someone if we don't see their humanity. Radical mercy, in whatever form it takes in modern society, can move us forward.
