NOTES FROM DEB

VIRTUE OF THE WEEK

I'd like to share with you today some thoughts about our Gospel—thoughts I have also shared in today's entry in the online Lenten retreat (https://www.ololmke.org/lent-prayer/).

We hear today of the Transfiguration of Jesus. I have always thought of this passage as a description of something that happened to Jesus. But what if this passage is about what happened to Peter, James, and John?

What if, when they were away from the crowds and the stress of their days, when the beauty and the peace of the mountainside soothed them, what if those disciples were the ones to undergo the change? What if on that day on the mountaintop, their vision was transfigured, and they were able to see Jesus as he truly was—dazzling and human and divine.

And if that happened to them, it could happen to us.

What would our vision be like if we truly saw God's presence in the people around us—if we saw everyone as a child of God? Their clothing may not turn a dazzling white but maybe we would see their smiles, the light of their eyes, and their inner beauty.

On this second Sunday of Lent, let's pray to have our vision transfigured so that we may see everyone as a sister or brother—a child of God.


